#### WELCOME!

Scattered in the world we gather together as God's people in worship. We bring the fragments of our lives to be healed and made whole in Christ as we gather in community.

Worship lies at the heart of the Christian life. It is in worship that we express our theology and define our identity. It is through encountering God within worship that we are formed and transformed as God's people. One of the glories of the Episcopal/Anglican Church is its liturgical worship. Liturgy refers to the patterns, forms, words and actions through which public worship is conducted.

As we gather, we bring our diverse gifts: gifts of music, dance, prophecy, teaching, preaching, and friendship. We present these gifts in the form of our most precious offering to God, our very selves, that all that we do may be for God's glory in the unity of Christ's church.

# ABOUT THE SEASON AFTER THE EPIPHANY

Epiphany (meaning "manifestation") celebrates the showing or appearance of God's Son in our midst. Older than Christmas, Epiphany has three primary images: the coming of the Magi to acknowledge Jesus; the Baptism of Jesus; and the first sign of the Kingdom when Jesus changed water into wine at the Cana wedding reception.


The Season after the Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of Jesus' ministry starting in Jerusalem and spreading to the cities and towns beyond. The season follows after Jesus' birth at Christmas, the visit of the Magi and the presentation of the infant Jesus by Mary and Joseph in the temple. The Season of Epiphany concludes with Jesus' being transfigured on the mountain before his temptation in the wilderness.

#### THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER Stand.

The Eucharistic Prayer, or Great Thanksgiving, is the prayer of the church to invite Christ to be present in the elements of bread and wine. Now we come to the second act in the drama with the Liturgy of the Table. It is based on Jewish Fellowship meals, particularly the Passover observance. But this second half of the service is not communion in and of itself. It is the whole service, both acts of the drama, that make up the Eucharistic.

Presider The Lord be with you.

- People And also with you.
- Presider Lift up your hearts.
- People We lift them to the Lord.
- Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- People It is right to give thanks and praise.

Presider It is truly right to glorify you, Holy One, and to give you thanks; for you alone are God, living and true, dwelling in light inaccessible from before time and for ever. Fountain of life and source of all goodness, you made all things and fill them with your blessing; you created them to rejoice in the splendor of your radiance.

> Countless throngs of angels stand before you to serve you night and day; and, beholding the glory of your presence, they offer you unceasing praise. Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under heaven, we acclaim you, and glorify your Name, as we sing (say),

Say at 8am:


People Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

#### The people stand or kneel.

Presider We acclaim you, holy God, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

> Holy God, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, Jesus lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose Jesus gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for Christ who died and rose for us, you sent the Holy Spirit, your own first gift for those who believe, to complete your work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for Jesus to be glorified by you, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; At supper with them Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."


After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Almighty God, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and descent among the dead, proclaiming Christ's resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting Christ's coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

People We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you, and we pray to you, Lord our God.

Presider God our Creator, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ.

> Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name. Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.



#### The Lord's Prayer

The Lord's Prayer follows. The link between our daily bread, and the spiritual food we receive in the Eucharist is an ancient connection. In the Lord's Prayer we ask for daily bread meaning the things we need to get through each day. But as a part of that, the bread also symbolizes God's presence.

Presider As our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray,

People Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

The Presider breaks the consecrated bread in view of the assembly.

Presider Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.


People Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

#### Invitation to Communion

## SHARING THE SACRED MEAL

This is Christ's table and all are welcome and all are fed. Our bread is gluten-, dairy- and nut-friendly. This Eucharistic table does not belong to the Episcopal Church or to St. Francis'. This is God's table, and all are welcome. In the Episcopal Church, we receive both the bread and wine, the Body and Blood of Jesus. If you choose not to receive communion, please come forward and cross your arms over your heart to receive a blessing.

#### **Post-Communion Prayer** Stand.

The Presider invites the congregation to stand and pray saying

- Presider God is with you.
- People And also with you.
- Presider Together, let us pray.

Silence is kept for a time.

- Presider Loving God, light of hope and promise of peace.
- People We give you thanks.
- Presider For the body and blood of Christ our Savior.
- People We give you thanks.
- Presider For the journey ahead and what we do not yet know;
- People For your presence, and your challenge, and the joy we cannot yet imagine, we offer ourselves. Thanks be to God. Amen!

#### THE BLESSING

The Presider blesses the people as a reminder of God's extravagant love and invites us to go into the world to be God's blessing.
